You can even visit the inside of these pyramids. However, be prepared, it's dark and narrow in there. You might want to bring a flashlight and some courage! You can also learn many fascinating facts, such as how the ancient Egyptians built these pyramids without modern machinery.

Don't forget to visit the Sphinx too. It is an enormous statue with the body of a lion and the head of a pharaoh which stands guard over the pyramids, keeping a close eye on things at all times.
